

OCBCC By-Laws

- Article I The organization of property owners and friends of the Ocean City Community shall be called "Ocean City Beach Citizens Council"
- Article II Purpose of the Organization. The purpose of the organization is to make efforts to solve common problems, provide aid, as well as work together for the common interest, preservation and welfare of historic Ocean City Beach. The Ocean City Beach Citizens Council is organized exclusively for charitable purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code or the corresponding section of any future United States Internal Revenue law.
- Article III Membership. Every property owner of Ocean City Beach is a member of the organization subject to annual renewal of dues.
- Article IV Dues. Dues will be determined annually by a vote of the membership for the next year. Dues are to be used to promote and improve the community, for correspondence, publicity, planned activities and other activities as voted by the membership
- Article V Officers. Election of Officers. The Nominating Committee will be appointed by the President in July and the slate of officers will be presented and voted upon at the Labor Day meeting. Those appointed will serve a term of two years beginning the next May.
- A. President - Will preside over all meetings
 - B. Vice-President - Will preside over meetings in the absence of the President
 - C. Secretary - Take notes at meetings, send out notices, publicizes activities to residents
 - D. Assistant Secretary - serve in the absence of the secretary
 - E. Treasurer - give a Financial Report at each meeting.
 - F. Financial Secretary/Assistant Secretary - Collects and records all monies and passes the report and all monies to the treasurer.
- Article VI All officers will formulate an Executive Committee which is given the power to act when necessary in lieu of Council Meetings. Ad Hoc members may be added at the discretion of the President.
- Article VII Financial Reporting. Books will be internally reviewed annually by the Finance committee as appointed by the President. An external audit will be performed every two years.
- Article VIII Meeting Dates. Regular meetings are scheduled around the Memorial Day, July 4th and Labor Day holidays. The President may call additional meetings when deemed necessary.
- Article IX Committees. Will be appointed by the President as deemed necessary, such as:
- A. Finance
 - B. Benevolence
 - C. Event and Programs
 - D. Historical
 - E. Nominating

Surplus. In the event of dissolution, after all liabilities and obligations of the corporation have been paid and discharged. The remainder of the corporation's assets will be distributed to the Episcopal Diocese of East Carolina.
